
This biennial conference is, in fact, three events in one:

- The Aboriginal Languages Gathering with an array of quality speakers, workshops and activities in indigenous languages and cultures, all made possible with the support of Alberta Education.



On behalf of CASLT, I would like to extend our thanks to the conference organizers, association staffs, and volunteers that have made all of this possible. Have a great conference!








Salon Level










Special Features
