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How Can Students Record and Edit Videos?



Recording

Use an iPad, tablet, or cell phone camera, or use a ChromeBook with the [Screencastify](#) extension.



Editing

Many free video editing apps are available, including [iMovie](#), [WeVideo](#), [YouTube Studio](#), and [Magisto](#).



Tip

Consider letting students decide what technologies they use to record and edit their videos.

How Can Students Share Videos?



Google Slides

To simulate a playlist, students insert their video into a slideshow shared with their teacher. Students can add a title and description to their slide, and can comment on their peers' videos in the speaker notes section.



Google Classroom

Students attach their video to an assignment, making it private for the teacher. The teacher can change the share settings on the assignment folder to allow students to be able to view every video.



Google Drive

Students upload their video to a Google Drive folder shared with the teacher. Videos can be viewed as a playlist, but there is no way to comment back and forth.



YouTube

Students add their video to a collaborative YouTube playlist. The Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FIPPA) and Copyright laws would apply.
